Public Health Update:

In the last month, there have been two confirmed cases of measles in residents of the DFW area (Collin and Denton counties) as well as an infected traveler who visited the metroplex from out of state. Public health wanted to take this opportunity to provide some basic information about measles and what to do if you have suspected measles patient in your facility.

Measles is characterized by a generalized maculopapular rash, fever, and possible cough, coryza (runny nose), and conjunctivitis. There is typically a prodromal stage first that begins with fever, cough, runny nose, and conjunctivitis before onset of rash. Individuals with measles are contagious four days before to four days after rash onset. It is important to notify your local health department immediately so that appropriate public health follow up can be initiated. For testing, PCR is the preferred laboratory test and it is offered only at the DSHS Laboratory in Austin and can be facilitated by your local health department. Drawing serology for IgM and IgG is also recommended and can generally be done at any reference laboratory.

Here are 5 key points to prepare for patients that present with measles-like symptoms at your facility:

- 1.) Educating staff on signs/symptoms of measles.
- 2.) Mask patients presenting with possible symptoms of measles, using a surgical/procedure mask and placing in AIIR for implementation of airborne isolation. Ensure that there are masks and "Cover Your Cough" signs available at facility entrances this will help with flu season around the corner as well.
- 3.) Check for documented evidence of immunity of all ED staff and those who would possibly be exposed. If there is anyone born before 1957, laboratory evidence of titers should be used for documented immunity.
- 4.) Ensure that healthcare workers are using the appropriate respirator that they were fit tested for. If they do not know which respirator to use, they need to inform their supervisor and contact Employee Health. They should not care for the patient.
- 5.) Healthcare workers should educate patients wearing surgical masks on how to don the mask properly and ensure it is kept on.
