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for asymptomatic and pre-symptomatic persons	
who have tested positive for SARS-CoV-2 for 10	
days from their positive test result. For	
symptomatic persons with suspected or confirmed	
COVID-19, visits for routine vaccination should	
be deferred until criteria have been met for them to	
discontinue isolation: at least <u>10 days after</u>	
symptom onset AND 24 hours with no fever	
without the use of fever-reducing medications	
AND COVID-19 symptoms are improving, AND	
the person is no longer moderately to severely ill.	
Consider further deferring (postponing) the	
vaccination visit until the person has fully	
recovered from acute illness.	
• Persons who have had a known exposure to a	
person with COVID-19 should not seek outpatient	
care solely for vaccination until their 14-day	
quarantine period has ended.	
• Vaccination visits for all of these individuals	
should be postponed to avoid exposing healthcare	
personnel and other patients in the vaccination	
setting to SARS-CoV-2.

COVID-19 Update	
DSHS Central Office, in conjunction with the Governor's	
Office, has determined that as of November 1, 2020	
DSHS adopted and began using the CSTE COVID-19	
case definition.	
The updated case definition added gastrointestinal	
symptoms to the clinical criteria (nausea or vomiting,	
diarrhea) as well as congestion or runny nose. Case	

classifications were also updated:	
Confirmed Case	
• Meets confirmatory laboratory evidence	
 Detection of SARS-CoV-2 by RNA 	
Probable Case	
• Meets presumptive laboratory evidence	
 Detection of SARS-CoV-2 by 	
antigen	
• Meets the clinical criteria and	
epidemiological linkage (with no	
confirmatory lab)	
• Suspect Case (NEW)	
• Meets supportive laboratory evidence with	
no prior history of being confirmed or	
probable	
 Detection of SARS-CoV-2 by
