Public Health Update	Kelsey Tatum with TX DSHS Region 2/3 reported:  As of 8/31/2022, Public Health Region 2/3, (PHR 2/3) has 712 Probable and Confirmed Monkeypox cases reported and that number is steadily climbing. Reported onset dates range from May 29th to August 24th. You can find the number of MPX cases by region on the DSHS 'News Updates' website and click on Monkeypox. https://dshs.texas.gov/news/updates.shtm [dshs.texas.gov]  Preliminary information for PHR 2/3 (North Texas Counties):  Cases have been reported in 12 of 39 counties in PHR 2/3  Majority (over 90%) of cases reported from the big 4 counties in Region 3 (Dallas, Tarrant, Collin and Denton)  98.5% of reported cases are Male  Age Group Distribution:  46.3% are between the ages of 30-39			

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- o 25.5% are between the ages of 18-29
- o 17.5% are between the ages of 40-49
- o 9.0% are between the ages of 50-59
- o 1% are 60+ years of age
- o <1% are <18 years of age

A friendly reminder, if any clinicians identify patients with rash that could be consistent with monkeypox, especially those with epidemiological factors, MPX should be considered as a possible diagnosis. The case definition for MPX can be found on the CDC website here: <a href="https://www.cdc.gov/poxvirus/monkeypox/clinicians/case-definition.html">https://www.cdc.gov/poxvirus/monkeypox/clinicians/case-definition.html</a> [cdc.gov]

- Standard precautions should be applied for all patient care, including for patients with suspected MPX to prevent MPX transmission. PPE used by personnel should include:
  - Gown
  - Gloves
  - Eye protection
  - NIOSH-approved particulate respirator equipped with N95 filters or higher
- O Activities that could resuspend dried material from lesions, e.g., use of portable fans, dry dusting, sweeping, or vacuuming should be avoided as much as possible.
- Standard cleaning and disinfection procedures should be performed using an EPA-registered hospital-grade disinfectant with an emerging viral pathogen claim. Products with Emerging Viral Pathogens claims may be found on EPA's List Q. Follow the manufacturer's directions for concentration, contact time, and care and
