- Johns Hopkins Center for Health Security letter urging reauthorization of the Pandemic and All-Hazards Preparedness Act







APIC Federal Priorities

118th Congress Snapshot

- PAHPA and many other authorizations are outstanding
- According to NPR this is one of the least productive Congresses in decades
- Congressional Departures (Retiring or seeking another office):
 - 43 House Members (23 Democrats and 20 Republicans)
 - 7 Senators (5 Democrats and 2 Republicans)





Federal Environment

Current State of Appropriations – FY 2024

- Another Continuing Resolution passed
 - Clean bill, Flat funded
 - "Laddered approach"
 - Funds Departments of Agriculture; Energy-Water; Military Construction-VA and Transportation-HUD through March 1
 - Funds the remainder of bills including Labor-HHS-Education and DOD through March 8
- House has included a number of challenging policy proposals
- Will sections of the Fiscal Responsibility Act be activated?
 - April 30
 - Across the board cuts
