The agency has discovered that some hand sanitizers are being packaged in beer cans, children food pouches, water bottles, juice bottles and vodka bottles. Additionally, the Final found hand sanitizers that contain food flavors, such as chocolate or

The U.S. Food and Drug Administration issued an emergency use authorization (EUA) to Abbott Diagnostics Scarborough, Inc. for its BinaxNOW COVID-19 Ag Card, the first antigen test where results can be read directly from the testing card, a similar design to some pregnancy tests. This design is fast a efficient for healthcare providers and patients and does not need the use of an analyzer. However, since antigen tests are not as sensitive as molecular tests, negative results from an antigen test may need to be confirmed with a molecular
9/1/2020	test prior to making treatment decisions. Read the FDA announcement.  The CDC has posted to its website updated recommendations for who should be tested for COVID-19. Although the previous recommendation was that asymptomatic people who had been in close contact with an individual infected with COVID-19 should be tested, the new recommendation is that such people not necessarily need to be tested, unless you are a vulnerable individual or a

	CMS announced it will resume routine inspections of all Medicare and Medicaid certified providers and suppliers. In response to the COVID-19 pandemic, CMS had previously suspended certain routine inspections to prioritize infection contain and immediate jeopardy situations and to give healthcare providers and supplied time needed to respond to the spread of COVID-19. CMS has directed the resumption of onsite revisit surveys, non-immediate jeopardy complaint surveys and annual recertification surveys as soon as resources are available. Read
